Pharmacy Access:

Syringes & Needles: In PA, it is legal for anyone to buy syringes and needles at a pharmacy without a prescription.

Naloxone: In PA, anyone can get opioid overdose reversal drug Naloxone (Narcan) at a pharmacy without a prescription. The state's standing order acts as a prescription for the general public. Medicaid covers the cost of Naloxone with no copay.

Vaccine for Hepatitis A & B:

Most pharmacies in Philly carry vaccines that will protect you against Hep A and B. Find one near you: bit.ly/2XCAYxA
